Tools to Success with E2020

Finding time at home to access E2020, either during the week, on weekends, or both, is clearly an important step to be made for the majority of our students. When we look at the hours on task for each student within our E2020 program, there is a HUGE discrepancy between students. There are about 10-15 students who are regularly, if not daily, working from home. Some parents are looking at their children's coursework from home and when their children return home at the end of the day they know just which subject(s) need to be attended to. It is not unreasonable to expect a half an hour's worth of E2020 time to be done at home per day. If your child is **absent**, it is imperative that they make up the 3 + hours of time they would normally be on line at school. This can present a challenge to parents without high speed internet access. Libraries, neighbors, family members, etc. may be the only way to address this for some. We have many students who miss school regularly. Illnesses are the cause of many absences, but we want to be sure families are aware that the hours lost at school on the computer MUST be made up in order to be successful and complete the four primary content areas, Math, Science, Social Studies and Language Arts.
