URGENT Request for Supplies

MAP Testing

The Measure of Academic Progress examination has begun. We are testing this week, Tuesday-Thursday, with make ups on Friday. As a state-funded school we are required to complete this assessment and will use it to provide you with important feedback on your child's academic strengths and areas for improvement. We will do this both in the Fall and in the Spring. Your child's advisory teacher will share this data with you at our Parent-Teacher-Student conferences next week.

Conferences and 1st Quarter Grades

Students took home a letter requesting your attention in signing up for a conference. We hope that no later than tomorrow you will have sent that form back so that teachers can confirm dates and times with you. Again, we will have half days Tuesday-Friday of **conference week (Oct. 20-23)**. Dismissal time will be _____. You will get your child's report card at this meeting, as well as get to look over their progress on E2020 with the teacher. Goals will be set with your child at that meeting, thus they **too are to attend.**

In the event that you **cannot** attend a conference time, you must arrange for a phone conference with your child's advisory teacher before the report card will be released to the student.
