From the Desk of Mr. Yates, Principal



Believe it or not, the school year is almost 2/3 complete! How time flies. As I reflect over the past months, I feel that we have made amazing progress in establishing a meaningful alternative for students in Valencia County. The staff and I, however, realize that there is a lot of work ahead to keep building and refining our school. Recently we have been busy ordering materials and equipment that we need to finish the year and surge forward into the future. At the same time, many of the policies and procedures have been developed to establish common understanding of our practices necessary in quality institutions.

You will see a new face in the office within a week or so. By then we will restructure the office staff to be able to serve you and your students in a more efficient manner. We continue to need volunteers and have developed guidelines so that you will be more comfortable when you participate. As we are well into second semester, it is important to ask yourself if you have given of your 20 hours of volunteer time as agreed in the enrollment of your child. If not, now is the time to make that commitment. If you are unsure about where you might fit in, please call us.

We have found that students who regularly do additional time on E2020 at home are much more successful. If this is an area of concern for you and your child, feel free to call for help in utilizing the features of E2020 or in establishing rituals for good study habits. An additional concern is that of

attendance. We need to have a daily average attendance of 92% in order to qualify for Annual Yearly Progress (AYP). Your cooperation with this is greatly appreciated. If your child must be out, we recommend that he or she spend at least three to four hours on E2020 courses to maintain current progress.

As a partner in the school, we ask that you help us maintain the standards established in the dress codes. There are four colors of shirts allowed; red, grey, navy blue, or royal blue. Black and brown are not allowed. Also, please remember that pants must be worn at the waist and must not reveal the underwear. We are trying to teach students that wherever one goes in the work place, dressing nicely will have positive outcomes.

Finally, we plan to host *summer school* for 20 days. This will most be for those who need additional help or time to finish their courses. More information will be coming shortly. Let us know if you have suggestions that can improve our current situation.

We have a new member of the S.O.D.A. "team". George Chavez has taken over for Mr. Tapia as our PE instructor, as well as our Social Studies teacher in the E2020 lab. 
Goals of a College-Bound Student
